

Rights to the National Survey and Cadastre's Standard Products

Copyright

Under the general rules of the Copyright Act, the National Survey and Cadastre has the copyright to the maps, data, programmes, services and other products of the National Survey and Cadastre.

This means:

- That the National Survey and Cadastre has the exclusive right to issue instructions for how said services and products may be reproduced, used or distributed.
- That the sale or distribution of said copies of these services and products to third parties shall not be permitted without permission from the National Survey and Cadastre.

Besides the general copyright protection, the National Survey and Cadastre also has a perpetual copyright on the agency's topographic maps and nautical charts.

KMS enforces its copyright. Therefore, any reproduction of National Survey and Cadastre maps or other data in analogue or digital form, whether processed or unprocessed, shall indicate "Copyright, National Survey and Cadastre Denmark" or "© National Survey and Cadastre Denmark".

License Rights

Upon entering an agreement on the use of National Survey and Cadastre products, it shall be specified how many users in an organisation may use the product.

License rights may be acquired in the form of:

- * 1-user licenses
- * 4-user licenses
- * 25-user licenses
- * Site licenses
- * Enterprise licenses

The number of users shall be set as the number of potential users who will have technical access to the National Survey and Cadastre product via a stand-alone installation or a network installation.

The site license gives the right to use the product within an organisation and by its employees as part of their employment. "Organisation" shall be used as the generic term for any legal entity such as a company, a municipality, a region or an agency. Some products are only sold with site licenses (or enterprise licenses).

The Enterprise license gives the right to use the product within an entire enterprise. "Enterprise" means a company with underlying operations (controlled by the parent company), or a ministry with related agencies.

Common Right of Use

The common right of use gives the right to:

- Use the product internally in an organisation for display of maps, analyses, calculations as well as analogue copying for internal use in conjunction with the performance of the normal business operations of the organisation.
- Copy the product digitally for backup purposes or the installation on hard drives/servers in accordance with the license rights of the agreement.
- Distribute copies of National Survey and Cadastre map products for

external use such as in reports, consultancies with third parties or similar scenarios, when stock is limited to 50 copies and when it takes place as part of the normal business operations of the organisation. Digital distribution to third parties shall occur only in raster format and National Survey and Cadastre maps shall be overlaid with geographical information of the organisation.

- Use National Survey and Cadastre map products in joint solutions with third parties when the third party has the corresponding rights to use the product.
- Make products/services available to consultants/subcontractors in conjunction with the performance of specific and time-limited tasks for the organisation, for a maximum duration of one year. The organisation shall be responsible for ensuring that the consultant/subcontractor deletes all data after completion of the task.
- Outsource the operation of databases with National Survey and Cadastre data to third parties.
- Display a limited number of fixed map sections on the Internet, defined by the National Survey and Cadastre Internet Rights, when the user also has a subscription to receive updates for the product.
 - * 1-user licenses are entitled to 10 map sections
 - * 4-user licenses are entitled to 20 map sections
 - * 25-user licenses are entitled to 50 map sections
 - * Site licenses are entitled to 100 map sections
 - * Corporate licenses are entitled to 150 map sections

Other analogue/digital copying, distributing or usage on the internet of National Survey and Cadastre products/services requires a separate agreement with the National Survey and Cadastre.

Map display right

Map display right gives the right to:

- Use the product as is via Kortforsyningen/Kortvisning (the Digital Map Supply/Map Display) for use in internal applications for the performance of tasks within the normal business operations of an organisation.
- Use National Survey and Cadastre map products in joint solutions with third parties when the third party has the corresponding rights to use the product.
- Make products/services available to consultants/subcontractors in conjunction with the performance of specific and time-limited tasks for the organisation, for a maximum duration of one year. The organisation shall be responsible for ensuring that the consultant/subcontractor does not have access to the Digital Map Supply after completion of the task.
- Display map data as raster images with a maximum size of 2000 x 1400 pixels and with one fixed cartographic representation.
- Retrieve information about the maps and services that are available through the Digital Map Supply.
- Retrieve metadata concerning specific individual objects in the map currently only possible with Kort10 and FOT-Kort10 (detailed topographic map) and Matrikelkortet (the cadastral map).
- Print maps for internal use within the organisation and with a maximum size of 1400 x 1400 pixels.

Other analogue/digital copying, distribution or Internet usage of National Survey and Cadastre products/services requires a separate agreement with the National Survey and Cadastre.

Internet right for dynamic map display

Internet right for dynamic map display gives the right to:

- Use the product for displaying maps on the Internet and with the built-in ability to zoom, pan and search by coordinates in the map. A separate agreement with the National Survey and Cadastre is required to use the product for the purpose of analysis or calculations on the internet, including

data manipulations where built-in server functionality enables "snap", "trace" or similar functions.

- Use the product on one domain when the use is part of the performance of the tasks and duties of the organisation – and for public authorities when it is part of the performance of their public tasks. A separate agreement with the National Survey and Cadastre is required to use the product on several domains or to give others access to making deep links to National Survey and Cadastre products on the Internet. The organisation shall take all reasonable steps to preventing deep links from being created. As a minimum, maps displayed shall indicate: "Deep links to National Survey and Cadastre maps are prohibited".

- Use the product for presentation purposes when overlaid with geographical information of the organisation. The product shall not be displayed on the Internet in such a way that – based on an overall assessment – it is found to be competing with the National Survey and Cadastre product range. All matters of dispute shall be submitted to the National Survey and Cadastre.

- Show maps by means of technology that ensures that only raster data may be transferred to the Internet user's workplace.

- Show maps on the Internet with a maximum size of 1000 x 1000 pixels, unless otherwise specified in a separate agreement.

- Establish a separate print function where the printed map shall correspond to a standard "screen shot".

All other uses of the product on the Internet will require a separate agreement with the National Survey and Cadastre.

Maps displayed on the Internet shall include "Copyright, National Survey and Cadastre Denmark", or "© National Survey and Cadastre Denmark" within the map frame, and the web page where the map is displayed shall include a link to the National Survey and Cadastre's conditions of use by means of the www.kms.dk/ophavsret

Internet rights for fixed map sections

Internet rights for the display of fixed map sections give the right to:

- Display the product as a fixed section of the map (raster image) in a document (HTML, PDF or similar) on the Internet as part of the performance of the tasks and duties of the organisation – and by public authorities as part of the performance of their public tasks.

- Use the product for presentation purposes when overlaid with geographical information of the organisation. The product shall not be displayed on the Internet in such a way that – based on an overall assessment – it is found to be competing with the National Survey and Cadastre product range. All matters of dispute shall be submitted to the National Survey and Cadastre.

- Display maps on the Internet with a maximum size of 1000 x 1000 pixels, unless otherwise specified in a separate agreement

- Print documents displaying National Survey and Cadastre maps.

All other uses of the product on the Internet require a separate agreement with the National Survey and Cadastre.

Maps displayed on the Internet shall include "Copyright, National Survey and Cadastre Denmark", or "© National Survey and Cadastre Denmark" within the map frame, and the web page where the map is displayed shall include a link to the National Survey and Cadastre's conditions of use by means of the www.kms.dk/ophavsret
